In the fall of 2007, Shawn implemented initiatives for developing sustainable living on campus by co-founding the Sustainability Theme House. Leading by example, Shawn and other residents of the eco-friendly home reduced energy consumption in the house.

“Over the past two years we have been tracking our consumption habits,” says

Shawn. “In comparison to the house before it became the Sustainability House, we have reduced our electricity consumption by 59 percent and water consumption by

78 percent.” The Sustainability House also promotes a campuswide recycling program and offers information on how to minimize environmental impacts on the campus at large.

Jane became involved with Posse in 2004 upon returning to the United States after 15 years living and working abroad in Tokyo, Hong Kong and London. Posse Chair Emeritus Michael Ainslie, a good friend of Jane and her husband Paul, invited them to the Posse Gala—an experience Jane recalls as truly inspirational.

“I was deeply impressed with Posse’s

mission,” she says. “It’s about identifying students of real promise in terms of their level of leadership, their potential to achieve, and their human qualities and values. Posse is need and color blind; I feel that’s very significant.”

Jane was raised in upstate New York

and New Hampshire—in predominantly small suburban communities. After receiving her undergraduate degree in economics and art history from Smith College and embarking on a career in banking, she was awarded a Rotary International Graduate Fellowship to study the Japanese financial markets at Sophia University in Tokyo, Japan. Her experience as a Rotary fellow helped shape Jane’s global perspective.

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Awards Ceremony Celebrates 123 New York Scholars

On January 6 and 7, Posse New York held Awards Ceremonies at The McGraw-Hill Companies' midtown Manhattan auditorium to welcome 123 new Scholars to the Posse family. Nearly 400 people were in attendance at both ceremonies to celebrate the accomplishments of these young leaders.

Last September, at the start of Posse's unique recruitment method—the Dynamic Assessment Process—Posse New York received close to 3,000 Scholar nominations from local high schools and community-based organizations. By the end of the recruitment season in December, 123 Scholars were awarded an impressive \$17.2 million in full-tuition leadership scholarships from Posse New York's partner institutions.

Posse was overjoyed to have The Nielsen Company, a longtime supporter of Posse's Career Program, sponsor the Awards Ceremonies for the second year in a row. Nielsen's director of public affairs, Crystal Barnes, spoke at the first Awards Ceremony, advising the incoming Scholars

"I was so happy and proud." *
