



Dear Posse Nominee:




THREE GOALS

Originally founded in 1793 as the Hamilton-Oneida Academy, Hamilton College occupies a 1,350-acre hilltop campus overlooking the New England-style village of Clinton, New York, and in close proximity to the Adirondack Park. The College's open curriculum gives students the freedom to shape their own liberal arts education within a research- and writing-intensive framework and with the guidance of faculty advisors who help students plan an individualized course of study that reflects their unique interests and skills. Hamilton enrolls 2,000 students (1,850 on campus, 150 in off-campus programs) from 47 states and 49 countries.

QUICK FACTS

- » Open Curriculum Hamilton's open curriculum allows you to choose courses because they interest you and fit your individual academic plan, not because you have to fulfill distribution requirements.
- » Speaking and Writing Hamilton is a national leader for teaching students to write clearly and speak persuasively.
- » Active Campus Learning at Hamilton is active and hands-on, and students are expected to contribute in class and out.
- » Difference Hamilton's campus is characterized by a diverse array of people with different backgrounds, experiences and ideas. Be yourself at Hamilton, and be respected for who you are.
- » Alumni Network Career planning is a priority for all students whether they intend to seek employment or pursue graduate study, and alumni are eager to help students identify internships and share career insights.

MOUNT OLYOKE

Mount Holyoke College attracts ambitious women from around the world who embrace complexity, cultivate curiosity, and resolve to become agents of change. Our vibrant community—tight-knit, diverse, inclusive, and socially conscious—includes a powerful global network of 35,000 alumnae. Rigorous academics in the classroom are combined with career and research experiences outside of the classroom, empowering Mount Holyoke students not only to face change, but to lead it. And our graduates put their passions to work: they thrive in all fields, on all continents, and in a vast array of languages.

QUICK FACTS

- » The 2016 Princeton Review identifies Mount Holyoke as a top-ranked destination for change makers—those driven to get involved and make a difference at home and around the world.
- » Students come from 44 states and 69 countries. About 25 percent are non-U.S. citizens. Thirty-seven percent of domestic students identify as African American, Asian American, Latina, Native American, or multiracial.
- » The College's Lynk initiative connects curriculum to career through paid (\$3,000) internship or research opportunities, pre-professional Nexus tracks, integrated advising, and alumnae mentoring.
- » Mount Holyoke faculty are leaders in their fields. The grants they receive—such as from NASA, NSF, and NIH—translate into research and career opportunities for students.
- » Through the robust Five College Consortium—including Mount Holyoke, Amherst, Smith, and Hampshire colleges and the University of Massachusetts Amherst—myriad social and academic opportunities await, at no additional cost.





Syracuse University

Syracuse University is a private international research university founded in 1870 whose more than 22,000 undergraduate and graduate students pursue studies in 11 schools and colleges. Syracuse is dedicated to advancing knowledge and promoting student success through teaching excellence, rigorous scholarship, and interdisciplinary research. Students not only enjoy the resources of a beautiful 270-acre main campus; they also learn at Syracuse's academic centers in New York City, Los Angeles, and Washington, D.C., and at seven study abroad centers.

OUICK FACTS

- With 200 academic programs and 100 minors to choose from, students can tailor their education to what they're interested in and rely on guidance from some of the finest and most nurturing scholars in the world.
- Syracuse is a place of diverse people who strengthen our values. Students represent all 50 states and 126 countries;
 25 percent are students of color; and 21 percent are first-generation college students.
- » Syracuse has one of the oldest and best-known study abroad programs, and nearly 50 percent of students participate in some type of study abroad experience.
- » Students enjoy—and make a difference on—a classic, residential campus, while having access to Syracuse, a city full of opportunities for internships, research, and civic engagement.
- » Syracuse's boundary-breaking alumni include Sarah Loguen, among the first African-American doctors; Ernie Davis, first African-American to win football's Heisman Trophy; and Eileen Collins, first woman to command a space shuttle.





VANDERBILT VUNIVERSITY

Vanderbilt University, situated on a beautiful 330-acre campus in the heart of Nashville, Tennessee, includes ten schools, of which four have undergraduate programs. The combination of excellent academic rigor, a vibrant campus life, and urban location attracts talented students from around the world, consistently earning the university a top-20 ranking from *U.S. News & World Report.* Vanderbilt is home to a diverse community of 6,900 undergraduate and 5,700 graduate students. Over 50 percent of undergraduates participate in academic research, and with a 7:1 student-faculty ratio, Vanderbilt affords easy access to faculty. First-year students live on The Martha Rivers Ingram Commons, a living-learning residential community, and students live in Vanderbilt housing all four years.

QUICK FACTS

- » 69 majors and 70+ minors are offered across four undergraduate schools: College of Arts and Science; School of Engineering; Peabody College of Education and Human Development; Blair School of Music.
- » Vanderbilt's vibrant campus life includes 420+ student organizations, 27 sororities and fraternities, over 150 study abroad programs, Division I athletics, more than 40 club and intramural sports, and exciting internship opportunities.
- » Nashville, Vanderbilt's hometown, regularly earns high marks for quality of life and employment opportunities, including #3 for Best Big Cities for Jobs (Forbes, 2019) and #2 for College City Gets High Marks (Princeton Review, 2020).
- » Vanderbilt has earned the #1 ranking for "Best Quality of Life" from Princeton Review in 2020.
- » 42.1% of students from the first-year class entering fall 2019 are from underrepresented minorities; 11.8% are international students.
- » 65% of undergraduates receive some type of financial assistance to attend Vanderbilt.
